It is crucial to follow God's plan for our lives because it leads us towards successfully running our race (following God's plan) and finishing our course. We can achieve this by understanding the importance of the great cloud of witnesses mentioned in Hebrews 11:39-12:1, Ephesians 3:14-15. The book also emphasizes the significance of Pastor Hagin not being able to finish his sister's race due to her illness and provides examples from personal journey according to 2 Timothy 4:7: running our race (following God's plan) in such a way that God's plan will be fulfilled, and Heaven will rejoice. We must strip off weights hindering our progress, such as wrong motives, selfish ambition, carnal inclination, flesh desire, pride, double-mindedness, spiritual sloth, fear, or running the race that God did not tell us to run. The secret to figuring out our purpose lies in understanding and applying Proverbs 19:21, Proverbs 16:9, and John 14:26. Key verses (patience or endurance), James 1:1-7, which describes the benefits of endurance, including three key attainments that benefit our faith and others. A personal example can be shared to demonstrate how these principles have been applied. Ultimately, running our race to reflect on include Hebrews 12:1-2, which advises us to run with effectively requires understanding God's plan for us through the Holy Spirit's guidance, stripping off hindrances, and cultivating the right mindset towards patience or endurance. Questions about spiritual fervor: 1. Are there moments you've gotten ahead of the Lord? What happened as a result? 2. How have you benefited from waiting between receiving a vision and seeing it become a reality? 3. If you were to compare your life to training for a 5K, which year would you be better equipped to endure it - when you trained at 1-2 days a week? 4. A story from Exodus about Moses illustrates the consequences of jumping ahead of God's plans. 5. Reflecting on Proverbs 3:15-16, should we try to understand things in our natural understanding? Why not? 6. Final thoughts from the evening discussion. Questions about maintaining spiritual fervor: 1. What does it mean to have a spirit-filled life, as described in Romans and Ephesians? 2. Think of someone who maintained the glow or spiritual fervor - what was unique about them? 3. Identifying characteristics with Believers who are aglow or have spiritual fervor, as seen in Acts 2:44-47. 4. Reflecting on the article about countenance and what other characteristics identify a Believer with spiritual fervor. Questions about walking in love: 1. Reading 1 John 2:10-11 - how can we expect to receive specific direction from God when walking in spiritual darkness? 2. Thinking of instances where you struggle to walk in love or maintain the attitude of your heart. 3. Reflecting on one song that fills your heart today or recently, as mentioned in Ephesians 5:18. 4. Considering the story of the Israelites in the desert and their consequences when they chose not to follow God wholeheartedly. Questions about discernment: 1. Reflecting on how we build ourselves up in spiritual fervor to engage with the world in our personal journey, considering the Holy Spirit as our counselor. 2. Final thoughts from this section of discussion. 1. Pastor Hagin suggests that instead of complaining during trials, believers should seek a deeper relationship with God. 2. He emphasizes that trials are the work of Satan, not God, and encourages believers to focus on giving thanks to God who can deliver them from these trials. 3. The devil is the author of our trials, but through faith and obedience, we can overcome them by living by faith rather than sight. 4. Pastor Hagin exemplifies this by laughing at his own trials, demonstrating the power of thanksgiving and faith in our lives. 5. Humility is another mark of the Holy Spirit, characterized by submission, which believers must understand correctly to live a strong spirit-filled life. 6. Pastor Hagin stresses that obedience is key to fulfilling God's plan for our lives, as we walk in the light of His Word and pray without ceasing. 7. The act of consecration is essential for both personal growth and witness, as it allows us to serve God fully and follow His will, even if it requires sacrifice. 8. Pastor Hagin encourages believers to examine their own hearts and acknowledge areas where they need to surrender or lay things on the altar, such as relationships or control. 9. Abraham's willingness to sacrifice his son demonstrated a deep trust in God's plan over your own. If you can't discern what the Lord is saying, following His guidance will be challenging. God communicates with us through our spirits. Reflect on Romans 8:16 and consider if this truth contradicts any preconceived notions about God's will or circumstances. Balance Godly counsel (Proverbs 11:14) with being Holy Spirit-led, prioritizing the latter. Consider a moment when you experienced the inward witness of the Holy Spirit. If you persist in violating your conscience or still small voice, you may experience negative consequences. Being led by the Holy Spirit versus circumstances affects our spiritual growth. Reflect on Matthew 18:18 and how seeking agreement from other Believers might benefit in our God-given path. To develop your spirit to discern God's plan for you, focus on what is necessary. Keep yourself from mixing God's revelation with personal "soul decisions" (feelings, natural reasonings, emotions). Pastor Hagin reminds us that the voice speaking through the Word is the same voice leading by our spirit. We can sharpen our ability to hear God speaking to us and prepare our mind and body to receive the inner witness. Consider if the hallmark of being filled with the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:2-4) describes you in your current season. If not, have you prayed to receive the baptism of the Holy Spirit or spoken in tongues? Would you like to? 1. Recent instances of being led astray by natural circumstances can help us grow spiritually. 2. What blocks our receiving God's leading and answered prayers? Read Mark 11:24-26. 3. Are other things stopping your prayers from getting answered? 4. To pray, we need to prepare ourselves to hear God clearly. 5. If you have obstacles on the way, what should you do? Pg 84-98 6. What risk is there when we become spiritually lethargic? Read pg 89 second paragraph. 7. How can you distinguish between your "soul desires" and the Holy Spirit's leadings? 8. Pastor Hagin says we need to check our motives in decision-making: why do I want to, is it selfish gain? 9. Have you ever made a decision due to impure motives? If so, how would you handle it differently now. 10. The root of all things grows from the realm of the soul. 11. Pastor Hagin describes and not honoring others (Daniel 10:1-2;12-13, Ephesians 6:10-12). 13. Do spiritual attacks really have power over us or do we have power over the attacks? Read Luke 10:19 and Mark 11:23-25. 14. The responsibility of receiving God's direction for your life belongs to who? 15. In the story of Acts 27, Paula was warned by God of impending danger. Much more spectacular guidance (confirmation). We want this because it confirms our understanding. 6) On page 116, Pastor Hagin explains hearing God's voice as a quiet inner voice, not an audible one. He describes it as one's personal spirit picking up on the Holy Spirit. 7) In Acts 11:1-2, Peter received a clear direction from God. This is different from the still small voice because it's more direct and explicit. 8) On page 124 to 125, we learn about Joseph's word of wisdom (W.O.W.) about his future. The timeline between Joseph's W.O.W. moment and the completion of the vision was significant. 9) Final thoughts: 1) Obeying God doesn't lead to what? Instead, it leads to something else. 2) Not obeying God may cost you what? Pastor Hagin shares his personal experience with disobedience regarding worrying and its impact on his faith. 3) He talks about how he persistently ignore God's Word, and what are the consequences? 4) Both old and new covenant promise freedom from sickness and disease, but this is fair, and why or why not? 5) What do we bring upon ourselves with disobedience, and what door does it pay off in the long run? 6) Genesis 37-50 tells the story of Joseph, who remained faithful to God despite many hardships. Jacob also had to remain faithful by sending his youngest son Benjamin to Egypt, unknowingly to him that he was sending him to see Joseph. What reward did Jacob receive for being faithful? 7) Final thoughts: 1) The minister in this story had the blinders removed regarding a belief his denomination didn't practice speaking in tongues. He chose to share the truth or keep his prestige and approval. What happened as a result? 2) When we are , we're on whose territory, resulting in what? 3) James 5:14-15 says something about sickness. Are there any passages that you've found helpful in your current season of life that you didn't know about previously? Please share. 4) It took the minister two years and a nearly fatal illness to submit to God's revelation about speaking in tongues and the Holy Spirit. Any thoughts. Forgiveness can also extend to ourselves. In this context, the concept of forgiving oneself is just as crucial as forgiving others. Pastor Hagin emphasizes that failure to forgive both others and ourselves can hinder us from receiving from God, growing spiritually, and fulfilling His plan for our lives. Key Verses: Philippians 3:13-14, 2nd Corinthians 5:17 When we have forgiven, what else does God tell us to do? He describes us in the current state of unforgiveness as being bound by mistakes of the past. If we harbor hatred or unforgiveness towards someone, we open the door to Satan's influence. New Commandment given in John 13:34 is to love one another as I have loved you. Pastor Hagin also shares a story about a mother who was healed when she chose to walk in love instead of allowing hatred to consume her. Consequences, including sickness and broken relationships (Galatians 4:1-3). On the other hand, loving God means following His plan for our lives. Get on track with God's plan for your life. Take responsibility and strive to serve Him genuinely. The choice is yours whether you fulfill your divine purpose, but ensure you're following God's path.
